WASTE REMOVAL/TOWN DUMP/BURNING PERMITS

In **Land O' Lakes**, trash must first be sorted and recycled. In order to take your trash to the dump, you must first purchase "dump cards" at the Tackle Box. \$10 and \$50 dump cards are available. The Tackle Box is open 7 days a week and is located downtown on Hwy B.

The dump is located west of downtown on County Road B, with the entrance just before the Bear Trap Inn. The dump hours are **Summer** (Memorial day weekend through Sept 30th) Sunday 9-12, Tuesday 8-3, Thursday 12-5 and Saturday 8-4. **Winter** (Oct 1st through May) hours at the dump are Tuesdays, 8-3; Thursdays, 12-4; Saturdays, 8-4

Only Land O' Lakes area residents and businesses may use the Land O' Lakes town dump.

Burning permits are required, and may be obtained at the Tackle Box. Telephone 715-547-3434

In **North Land O' Lakes**, Michigan, residents may use the Watersmeet Transfer station. It is north of Watersmeet on Highway 45 at Transfer Station Road. The hours open are **Summer** 8-4 from Monday through Sunday (except Wednesdays) and **Winter** 8-4 Monday through Saturday (except Wednesday) Your trash must be sorted for recycling here as well.

POST OFFICE

The **Land O' Lakes** Post Office is located at 4272 County Road B. The lobby area is open 24 hours. Daily mail is available in the post office boxes after 10 a.m.

The business area of the post office is open 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday (closed 1:00 to 2:00 p.m. daily for lunch). On Saturdays, you can transact business there from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. . Local telephone number is 715-547-3640.

In **North Land O' Lakes**, in Watersmeet at 906-358-4781. Many people who live close to Land O' Lakes have post office boxes in the Land O' Lakes Post Office and utilize the services of that post office.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION/DRIVER'S LICENSES

To register your car in **Wisconsin**, you will have to go to Eagle River on Wednesdays between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. You can also get your new driver's license there on Wednesdays as well. On any weekday besides Wednesday, you must go to Rhinelander (see directions below).

To change your car registration, bring your title or registration certificate.

To get your new driver's license, bring your out-of-state license (which you will have to surrender) and your social security card. As long as your license is still current, you will not have to take the driving test, just the vision test.

Hours - Mondays, 8:45 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Tuesdays through Fridays, 8:15 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. To get to the Rhinelander office, take Highway 45 south to Eagle River, Highway 70 West to the left turn onto Highway 17 South to Rhinelander. In Rhinelander, get on Highway 8 West (toward Oneida County Airport). At the intersection of Highway 8 and Highway 47, turn right onto Highway 47 and look for signs.

If you live in **North Land O' Lakes**, you will need to register your car in **Michigan**. Telephone 906-667-0271 for hours and location.

VOTER'S REGISTRATION

In **Land O' Lakes**, you may register to vote on the day of the election at the polling place in the Land O' Lakes Town Hall.

LIBRARY

The **Land O' Lakes Library**, located at 4242 County Hwy B, serves both the Land O' Lakes and North Land O' Lakes communities. Telephone 715-547-6006. The library is open Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Wednesdays from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Memorial Day to Labor Day and Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., Wednesdays 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Labor Day to Memorial Day. Closed Sunday. There is a children's story hour September through May on Wednesdays at 10 a.m. and Home at the Library September through May on alternating Tuesdays at 1 p.m. The Community Room is available for group meetings. Librarian/Director is Julie Zelten;. The Friends of the Library meets on the first Tuesday of the month at 10 a.m. in the Community Room. This is a well stocked library with 17,530 books, 1,092 audio materials, 1,178 DVD/Video materials and online catalog to access the library's collection, six high speed internet computers, **wireless internet access**, children's computer with games, and numerous magazines and newspaper. The average number of patrons is 1,495.

VILAS COUNTY

The county is approximately 652,067 acres in size with 555,374 acres of land and 93,923 acres of water. The county harbors 563 named lakes and 757 unnamed lakes. It is located in northern Wisconsin and against the Upper Michigan border. The population in 1890 was 1706 and grew to 3,801 in 1895 and 4,929 in 1900. In 1920 the population was 5,649 and in 2005 the population had increased to 22,215.

The county is governed by 21 supervisors representing 21 districts. Vilas County has a .5% county sales tax in addition to the State sales tax of 5%. The board meets the third Tuesday in January, March, April, June, August and September. The annual budget meeting is held the second Tuesday in November. The courthouse is located at 330 Court Street in Eagle River. The mailing address is Vilas County Courthouse, 330 Court St, Eagle River, WI 54521. Office hours are Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The Vilas County Zoning department handles all permit applications and subsequent inspections for building construction, remodeling, septic systems, bulldozing/filling and conditional uses. The department also deals with new subdivisions and condominium projects. Another helpful source of state and county information would be Kelly Haverkampf at the UW Extension office in Eagle River.
